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**Greater Access to COVID-19 Care for All Full-Time
Members and Their Eligible Dependents and Part-Time
Plan C Members and Their Eligible Dependents**

The Board of Trustees of the UFCW Local Union 919 and Contributing Employers' Health and Welfare Fund ("Fund") recognizes that we are in extraordinary times. Let us begin by sincerely thanking you and all of our UFCW members and families that are on the front lines of this crisis. As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to grip our nation, your service is irreplaceable. More than ever you have proven to all Americans that the hard work you do is absolutely essential.

The Board of Trustees recognizes your extraordinary effort and wants to continue to support you by delivering healthcare coverage that is simple to use and affordable.

Effective immediately, the Fund will waive ALL cost share and copays associated with COVID-19 related testing and treatment through December 31, 2020 for any member or dependent with active medical coverage with this Fund. This includes waiving deductibles, copays and coinsurance.

In addition, the Fund recognizes that visiting your physician in-person may be challenging. Effective immediately, if you wish to contact your physician as a tele-health visit, the Fund will cover this visit subject to the applicable cost share, except in the case of COVID-19 related testing and treatment through December 31, 2020 where all cost sharing is waived.

As you are aware, the Fund partners with CIGNA for access to their wide network of providers.
