Your Union Leadership and Staff is ready for whatever 2022 has instore for us. This brings me to the topic of my article, Union Leadership and Staff. Do you know who your Union Leadership and Staff is at Local 919? I thought it might be a good opportunity to brag a little about the Local Union. What makes this a great Local Union is our diverse membership. Behind the membership, is a lean and mean Local Union Staff. So, lets meet them!

President Mark A. Espinosa – Mark just celebrated his 36th distinguished year with Local 919 and the Labor Movement. In addition to proudly serving Local 919 as President, he is a Trustee of the CT AFL-CIO and has serves as President of UFCW New England Council. Mark began as an organizer at UFCW Local 919 and went on to become a full-time Business Agent. He was elected in 1989 and served as Secretary-Treasurer of the Local, and has been the elected President since 2001. Mark was also a founding member of Lea's Foundation for Leukemia Research and served on the board of the United Way's Hartford chapter. He is also a Member on Advisory Committee UFCW "United Latino" coalition. In 2012, Mark was named co-chair of the Advisory Committee of the Connecticut State Health Insurance Exchange. Mark also serves as Lead Labor Trustee for the Local 919 Pension Fund and a Trustee of the UFCW New England Health Fund. Secretary-Treasurer Jason Dokla - My Membership with Local 919 started as a 15-year-old cart pusher at Stop & Shop in 1989 and quickly moved through the ranks.
